What are your top three priorities for the HPS Board of Education?

My top three priorities for the HPS Board of Education are: advocating for representation for the 25% of students that are Hispanic/Latino, ensuring the highest quality of education for every student in our district, and supporting educators at the highest level to ensure the success of each student in our district.

Early childhood education programs lay crucial groundwork for students throughout their K-12 journey. As a member of the HPS School Board, how would you suggest improving our children's early educational experiences?

Budgetary issues will always be a concern, but I believe that the district can utilize funds responsibly while not limiting educational or extra-curricular opportunities. I would suggest looking at each budget line item for ways to cut spending that would not impact educators or students. I would also encourage grant opportunities at the state and federal levels, and other opportunities for additional revenue streams.

Partnerships, especially with nonprofit organizations such as United Way, STARS, and the local Collaborative, offer excellent resources for students in our community.
