Campaign statements often include "lower taxes," but, as costs increase, how do you prioritize realistic choices?

The county board is responsible for the budget. One needs to prioritize the funds. Good staffing and maintaining the infrastructure are my most important goals.

What is your vision for the growth and development of Hastings/Adams County businesses and industries?

Adams County is a rural agricultural county. I believe industries connected to agriculture will thrive in our county. Adams County is a great place to raise a family.
